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NGC PROFILE

The **National Geography Challenge (NGC)** is an annual event conducted by the Junior Philippine Geographical Society - UP Diliman (JPGS-UPD) since 2012, except for the years 2020 to 2022 due to the COVID-19 restraints on holding this competition. **This year's event's main objectives are as follows:**

1. To **promote** the distinct discipline of geography amongst Filipino youth;
2. To **develop** geographic literacy and social awareness;
3. To **provide** a venue for alternative learning of the discipline of geography outside the four walls of the classroom; and
4. To **encourage** participation amongst high school students.



NATIONAL GEOGRAPHY CHALLENGE

These objectives will be exhibited through the event's four competitions that is open for students **Grades 9 to 12**. In the contests, the participants are expected to showcase their knowledge of and skills in the field of geography while also being socially aware.

This coming **May 11, 2024**, the **10th National Geography Challenge** will be entitled ***"DAM•DA•MIN: Feeling and Imagining About Space"***, introducing and promoting the field of emotional geographies to Filipino students and the youth sector. It is a topic within the discipline of geography that deserves attention for its incorporation of human emotions in the study of spaces. In this period of increasing awareness and rationalization of the mental states of individuals, the concept of emotional geography shows that there is more to the discipline than the cliches of maps, capitals, and flags.

THEME

Damdamin or “**emotion**” is not often the first thing that comes to mind when one mentions the discipline of geography. The sciences often deal with quantifiable information and objective facts. In the popular imagination, geography deals with latitudes and longitudes, accurate distances and scales, and high resolution satellite images. Technological advancements have allowed for the realistic viewing of spaces and places far beyond the geographers of old can ever dream of seeing for themselves. Much of the Earth's surface has been photographed and mapped. Every person with a phone can be their own navigator.

But how does one navigate through space and interact with different faces and places without damdamin? Without feeling a multitude of emotions? Without the irrationality that we human beings choose to avoid discussing? **Damdamin is as much a powerful tool in studying places** as much as the most advanced remote sensor. Places cannot exist without giving meaning to space; meaning cannot exist without the human mind and heart experiencing the geography of the world around us.

NGC 2024 aims to highlight this less known aspect of geography and showcase its importance in the formation of geographic thought and how we view places. As stated by Professor Sarah Wright of the University of Newcastle, Australia (2012),

“...the social sciences have increasingly recognised the role of emotions in shaping society, and in defining and transforming people and place.”

Feelings like anger, despair, joy, hate, and the like twist and influence our perspectives on spaces, turning them into something human. This counters the dehumanization of Geography as a spatial science and centers subjective understanding and humanistic philosophies (Parr, 2013). As important as quantitative data is in studying and translating the human world and experiences, we must also not forget about the significance of human attachments and our relationship with nature in understanding geography.

By emphasizing this more humanistic approach in explaining the world, we are hoping to change the young geographers' perspective on Geography from only being about hard data into something more community-centered - something more contextual and understanding. Geography isn't only about the science of spaces, it is also about the people living in them.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. Nature of event

This year, the National Geography Challenge (NGC) will be composed of four competitions: **Quiz Bowl, Photo Essay Making, Storymap Making, and Impromptu Speech.** Each contest shall have its own sets of rules and mechanics to be followed. Some will be done in pairs and others shall be strictly individual. Kindly refer to the specific guidelines for each event as a guide found on pages 8-16.

2. Participants

This event is open to all **Grades 9, 10, 11, and 12** students from both public and private schools all over the country.

The school shall be represented by:

Two (2) students for the Quiz Bowl

One (1) student for the Photo Essay Making Contest

One (1) student for the Story Map Making Contest

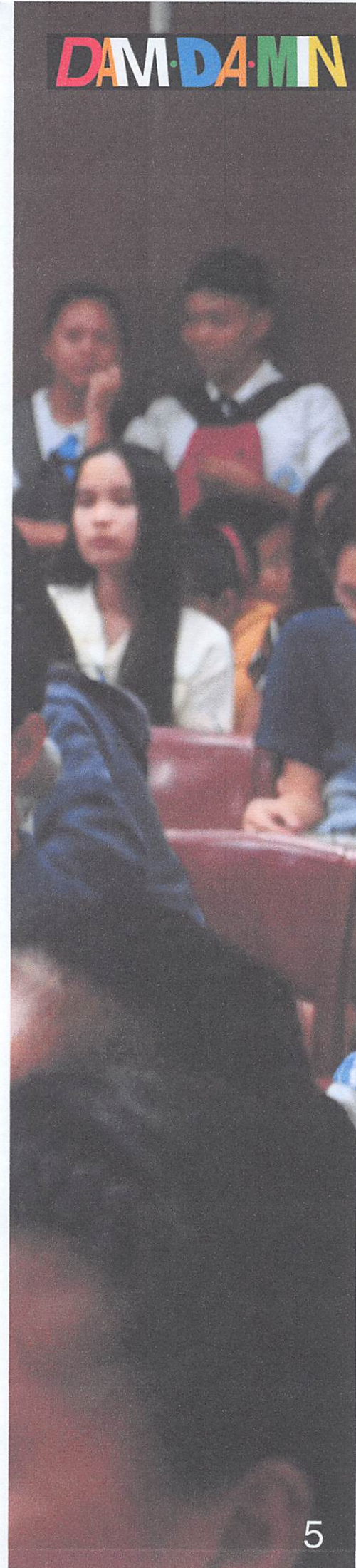
One (1) student for the Impromptu Speech Competition

Each student can participate in only ONE contest.

3. Registration

Participants must fill out an initial registration form to secure registration to the event. Link to the pre-registration to be accomplished by **April 29, 2024:** <https://bit.ly/NGC2024PreRegistrationForm>. Please be guided accordingly.

Registration will be done on the day of the event itself (May 11) to ensure that participation is certain.



Participants

A registration fee of **five hundred pesos (PHP 500.00)** for private and science high schools and **four hundred pesos (PHP 400.00)** for public high schools per participant for each event. You may opt to immediately **pay in full** through a deposit or pay in **two installments**.

If choosing the latter, a **non-refundable** reservation fee of **two hundred pesos (PHP 200.00)** per participant shall be paid through deposit **within one week of accomplishing the pre-registration form** to confirm the registration. The remaining **three hundred pesos (PHP 300.00)** for private and science high schools or **two hundred pesos (PHP 200.00)** for public high schools can be paid until **May 6, 2024**.

Coach(es)

A registration fee of **two hundred pesos (PHP 200.00)** for private and science high schools and **one hundred fifty pesos (PHP 150.00)** for public high schools per coach for each event. You may opt to immediately **pay in full** through a deposit or pay in **two installments**.

If choosing the latter, a **non-refundable** reservation fee of **one hundred pesos (PHP 100.00)** per coach shall be paid through deposit **within one week of accomplishing the pre-registration form** to confirm the registration. The remaining **one hundred pesos (PHP 100.00)** for private and science high schools or **fifty pesos (PHP 50.00)** for public high schools can be paid until **May 6, 2024**.

COMPETITION MECHANICS

A. Quiz Bowl

1. If the organizing committee receives **less than or equal to forty (40)** group sign ups, the competition will proceed with the quiz bowl format. Upon reaching more than 40 sign ups, a qualifying round will be held before the actual quiz bowl.

a.) The qualifying round will be in the form of a **60-item multiple choice** exam that must be answered individually. Only the **Top 30 schools with the highest average scores will qualify for the Quiz Bowl** should the qualifying exam push through.

b.) Further details about the preliminary exam shall be given to the participants at most **five (5) days** prior to the event proper.

2. The questions are prepared exclusively by the members of JPGS-UPD and are checked by the Board of Judges.

a.) The composition of questions are as follows:

- i. True or False
- ii. Identification
- iii. Multiple Choice
- iv. Matching Type
- v. Computation

b.) The composition of the Board of Judges are three (3) faculty members of the Department of Geography.

The questions will fall on any of the following fields of geography: **Physical Geography, Human Geography, Environmental Geography, Geographic Thought, Geographic Techniques, and Regional Geography.**

3. One group with **two (2) members** each per school are allowed for the contest. Team members should be in **Grades 9-12.**

4. Each team will be provided with boards, pen, and an eraser for their answers.

COMPETITION MECHANICS

5. The questions will be read **twice** by the Quizmaster. After the second reading, the Quizmaster will say “go” and only then will the team be allowed to write the answer.

a.) Groups who answer before the “go” signal **will be warned** on the first time, their answer for the question **voided** on the second time, and **disqualified** from the competition on the third time.

6. Each team will have a facilitator. The teams must raise their answers when the Quizmaster tells that the time is up. **Late answers will not be accepted.** The team facilitator will raise the number of his/her team if they get the correct answer.

7. The contest has three (3) rounds: **Easy, Average, and Difficult.** Below shows the corresponding time limit, number of questions, and points per question. **No teams will be eliminated after each round.**

- (1) Easy - 10 secs. - 15 questions - **1 point**
- (2) Average - 15 secs. - 15 questions - **2 points**
- (3) Difficult - 20 secs. - 10 questions - **3 points**

8. After the Difficult round, the three teams that acquired the most points will be declared the 1st Place, 2nd Place, and 3rd Place, respectively.

9. In case of a tie after three levels, **five (5) extra questions will be asked** in order to break such.

10. The participants and the duly registered teacher-coach of the team **are the only people allowed to make protests.** All protests should be referred to the Board of Judges immediately before the Quizmaster reads the next question. The facilitators should wave the number when contentions occur.

11. The top three (3) participants will be selected as the winners of the contest based on the final scores.

B. Storymap Making

1. This competition is open to **Grades 9 - 12** students from all schools in the country. A single student must represent each school.
2. The students are expected to **create a story map on any topic that is within the scope** of this year's theme: "**DAM·DA·MIN: Feeling and Imagining About Space.**"
3. The story map should be accompanied by a **short essay**. The essay must strictly have **100 - 150 words only**.
4. The only tool to be used by the students will be an online mapping software to be announced **at the day itself**.
5. There will be a workshop to guide the students on how to use the required mapping software. After that, the competition proper will proceed.
6. The competition will be held **face-to-face, on the spot**. Prepaid load will also be provided for data connection in case the participant has internet connection problems. **The participant must bring their own laptop for the event.**
7. The participants are **allowed to take pictures that are related to the theme before the event proper** to be used as content for the storymap.
8. Plagiarism and copyright violations are extremely prohibited. The contestant will be **automatically disqualified** in case of violation.
9. Maps made prior to the workshop scheduled on the event are not allowed to be submitted as official outputs and will be considered grounds for disqualification.
10. The top three (3) participants will be selected as the winners of the contest based on the final scores.

C. Photo Essay

1. The competition is open to **Grades 9-12** students from all schools in the country. Only one (1) student must represent each participating school.
2. The competition requires a short outdoor activity for photo taking. The student and their parent/guardian **must submit a signed waiver 3 days before the competition day**. Link to waiver and submission folder: **NGC 2024 Photo Essay Waiver** (See page 19) and **Waiver Submission Bin**
3. The student is expected to bring their gadgets for the competition (e.g. camera, phone, and laptop). **Any type of gadget may be used** for photo taking.

COMPETITION MECHANICS

4. The student is expected to **bring their USB flash drive for the submission of entries**. It must be labeled with school initials and their surname.
5. The student is expected to **attend the photo essay workshop** hosted by the NGC 2024 before participating in the competition.
6. The student is expected to take pictures around the **selected UP Diliman premises** that the organizing team advises. One facilitator will be assigned per five (5) participants.
7. The student must produce one (1) picture following the NGC 2024 theme, “*DAM·DA·MIN: Feeling and Imagining About Space*” and write a **minimum of 300 words to a maximum of 500 words essay from it**.
8. Any photo-editing software may be used by the student, provided that the photo **will only undergo minimal editing** (e.g. cropping, exposure, and color adjustments).
9. Kindly take note of these technical specifications:
 - a. **Photo orientation:** Landscape (4:3) or Portrait (3:4)
 - b. **Essay output:** A4 size, Times New Roman or Arial (font size 11), 1.5 spacing, justified indentation
 - c. **Language:** English or Filipino
 - d. **Submission:** One (1) image file and one (1) pdf file for the essay.

10. Once registered for the event, a confirmation email will be received. It must be presented on the competition day.

COMPETITION MECHANICS

11. The photo essays will be judged according to the following criteria:

Theme and Concept. The photo essay effectively communicates a story or a message that is relevant to the NGC 2024 theme.	20%
Composition and Visual Impact. The image shows attention to elements such as framing, perspective, colors, and balance. It effectively evokes an emotional response and makes a strong visual impact on the viewer.	20%
Visual Storytelling and Narrative. The photo captures a scene that prompts curiosity and invites interpretation, while the essay expands on narrative, providing context, interpretation, and insight.	30%
Creativity and Originality. The photo essay provides unique perspectives, unconventional approaches, and creative interpretations of the theme. It shows the author's creativity, and critical thinking skills providing the viewers with rich insights and experience.	15%
Overall Impact and Effectiveness. The photo essay leaves a lasting impression on the viewer; prompting reflection and discussion. The photo and the accompanying essay convey a cohesive story and message. The submission demonstrates coherence, clarity, and depth to provoke thought, elicit emotion, and inspire reflection.	15%

COMPETITION MECHANICS

D. Impromptu Speaking / Dagliang Talumpati

1. Each participating high school shall be eligible to field only **one** (1) contestant for the event.
2. The order of performance shall be determined by a **randomizer** to be implemented by the Organizing Committee.
3. The contestants will be confined in separate rooms after the orientation and before the contest proper.
4. Before proceeding to the waiting rooms, participants will **only be allowed to bring a pen and index card**. Using an electronic device such as, but not limited to, **phones and tablets will merit disqualification**.
5. Each contestant shall be given only **three** (3) minutes to read the prompt and prepare their speech and another **five** (5) minutes to deliver it.
6. The speech may be delivered in **English, Filipino, or Taglish** depending on the contestant's preference.
7. The contestant **must be in their school uniform** when delivering their speech. The use of other attires and/or outfits is strictly prohibited.
8. The contestant must be aware of the time during their delivery. If the duration of the speech delivered exceeds five (5) minutes, **two percent** (2%) shall be deducted from the total score. The contestant shall be allowed a maximum of thirty-second (30 secs) extension, after which they will be **forced to stop**.
9. The contestant shall be accompanied by only one person in the room and will serve as a timer. Flashcards shall be raised to remind the contestants of the remaining time.

COMPETITION MECHANICS

10. The criteria for judging shall be:

Content, Reasoning, and Analysis. The speech exhibits a clear and appropriate response to the given prompts. Concepts are properly elaborated and explored through substantial and relevant discussions. Examples are incorporated when necessary and the ideas are sensible, logical, and rational to the average listener.	45%
Style. The speaker exhibits a command of the language evident in the wording and phrasing of the speech. It avoids overly complex language and shows the depth of expression and thoughtful consideration.	20%
Delivery and Presence. The speaker exudes confidence and conviction in delivering the speech. Their demeanor leaves a lasting impression and effectively connects with both the audience and judging panel.	20%
