RE: Local Celebration of World Rabies Day

World Rabies Day is an international campaign coordinated by the Global Alliance for Rabies Control which aims to raise awareness about the impact of rabies on human and animals, provide information and advice on how to prevent the disease, and how individuals and organizations can help eliminate the main global sources. Since 2010, with the implementation of the City Rabies Ordinance 10-01, the City of Tayabas, thru the Office of the City Veterinarian, has been formally participating in this global event through organizing various activities: Slogan- making contest participated by the Department of Education and the Barangay Rabies Prevention and Control Coordinators in 2010; Poster-making contest for elementary, high school and alternative learning system students in 2011 and 2012; Jingle-making contest in 2013; and Fun Run against Rabies since 2014. Awarding of the best barangay in rabies prevention is also included in the yearly celebration since 2011.

This year, the City of Tayabas will again participate in the celebration of World Rabies Day (September 28) thru the "10th City of Tayabas Run Against Rabies", a fun run/ fun walk/ unity run on the 5th of October, Saturday. Assembly in front of the Rizal Park will start at 4:30 am, and gun start will be at 6:00 am. *Registration for the activity is free*, and registrants may visit our office at the Lupa Hall Compound for early registration and for their individual race bibs (no onsite registration) until October 3 (office hours). Singlet design is also available. Medals and cash prizes will be awarded to winners of various categories during the program, as well as the awarding of winners for the annual "Search for Best Barangay in Rabies Prevention and Control". Various raffle prizes will also be given away.

Being one of the local partners in rabies prevention, we would like to invite all elementary and high school teaching and non-teaching staff and students to join in the activity. This is an excellent way to show your support in eliminating the dreadful disease that is rabies, and an opportunity to promote physical fitness among your department, as well.

We hope that this would merit your important endorsement. Together, let us work for a rabies-free Tayabas!
