The HJCP Studio, in collaboration with Himari Performing Arts, Inc., will present a backto-back stage production titled *Dalawang Mukha ng Pag-ibig*, a compelling adaptation of two iconic Filipino literary masterpieces:

Title	Synopsis
Kay Selya	Drawn from Francisco Balagtas' timeless verses, it presents a heartfelt lament of a man betrayed by love. Once filled with passion and devotion to his beloved Selya, the speaker grapples with heartache and disillusionment.
Mga Santong Tao	Written by Tomas Remigio, it is a satirical portrayal of love, in a different light, this time, masked by hypocrisy and social pretense. Set in a conservative community, the story exposes the irony of those who preach morality yet secretly engage in deception and desire.

The original theatrical work aims to rekindle the appreciation of classical Filipino literature among the youth while offering an immersive and artistic experience that aligns with the K to 12 curricula, particularly in the areas of literature, values education, and performing arts.

The national campus tour will run across various schools nationwide from August 2025 to March 2028.

The target participants are learners from junior high school, senior high school, and college students from both public and private schools, as well as the educators in Filipino, History, Literature, Sociology, Theology, and the Arts, school personnel, and government employees.

Participation of learners and teachers from public and private schools shall be purely voluntary and will not hamper instructional time in compliance with the provisions of DepEd Order (DO) No. 012, s. 2025, titled Multi-Year Implementing Guidelines on the School Calendar and Activities and DO 9, s. 2005 titled Instituting Measures to Increase Engaged Time-on-Task and Ensuring Compliance Therewith and the policy on off-campus activities stated in DO 66, s. 2017.
