The BCYF National Search for Hometown Heroes Award was conceived to recognize individuals who help their neighbors and community in a consistent manner, where their social program is not their job, business or profession. It is meant to encourage exemplars to continue their "Volunteerism with a Purpose" by introducing them to a wider audience of potential benefactors and supporters.



Criteria of the Award:

- 1. The Search is open to any individual who is a Filipino or Permanent Resident of the Philippines.
- 2. The Nominee must be the Primary Mover or reason why the project succeeded.
- 3. The Project may have been organized by, or with, others.
- 4. The Nominee should be actively involved in the project for at least five (5) consecutive years.
- 5. The Project should be currently active and has also existed for at least five (5) years.
- 6. The Coverage or Scope of the Project should be an identifiable Geographical area such as the purok, barangay, town or city in the Philippines.
- 7. The Project should preferably contribute to national social cohesion.

Requirements:

- 1. Accomplished S4HH Nomination Form.
- 2. Proof of success of the Project (e.g. testimonials, acknowledgements, Photos and videos, as feasible).
- 3. Direct testimonials from Beneficiaries carry greater weight during evaluation.
- 4. Signed Privacy Notice and Consent Form.
- 5. Nominations should be in writing (printed or by email is acceptable).
- 6. Accomplished forms, together with other requirements, should be sent either to participating rotary club representatives (as applicable), regional council representatives (as applicable), and other partner organizations of BCYF for this Award
- 7. A 5 to 7-minute video summarizing the reasons why the nominee believes he/she should be considered for the S4HH.
- 8. All materials should be duly notarized.
- 9. All financials for the project.
- 10. A live interview with the respective screening committees may be required.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs):

1. Who can be nominated?

- Any Filipino or Permanent Resident of the Philippines who has committed themselves to create a consistent, positive impact in their community.
- All previous nominees can reapply and be considered nominees and all previous finalists are considered as semi-finalists for the current award.
- Anybody can self-nominate.
- 2. Does the nominee have to be a resident of the community or geographical area he/she is helping?
 - No, as long as the Nominee is a Filipino or Permanent Resident.
- 3. Can the Project Beneficiaries be non-Filipinos?
 - · No, for this year Award, the beneficiaries must be Filipino.
- 4. Can organizations, groups or teams working be Nominees?
- · No, however, the respective members or heads thereof may qualify.
- 5. Can projects involving regular work duties or assignments qualify?
 - No, the project cannot be one that involves the Nominees' regular business, work or assignment.
- 6. Can a person who has died be a Nominee?
 - No, however, a person who passes away after nomination may still be considered and awarded posthumously.
- 7. Is there a separate category for the Youth, Young Professionals, and so on?
 - · No, the search is open to all.
- 8. What prizes, if any, may the Nominee receive for joining and winning this Search?
 - For the Grand Winner, he or she will receive a certificate and trophy during the awarding ceremony, as well as being featured in various local and/or regional media, through the RMN Radio Network, as well as through other media partners, which may include live interviews.
 - For the Finalists, they will be featured in local and / or regional media, through the RMN Radio Network, as well as through other media partners, which may include live interviews.



THE AWARD PROCESS

The following flowchart details the award process which all nominees in the National Search for Hometown Heroes, as well as other recognition programs of BCYF, must undergo.

- The S4HH Committee will accept and review submitted nominations. This committee receives nominations, or add its own nominees.
- From this, the S4HH Committee will interview the nominees then decide who will be the Finalists, and recommend who will be the Awardee/s.
- The BCYF Board of Trustees will review the recommendation from the S4HH Committee, and decide who shall be the Awardee/s.
