SUBJECT: Changes in the Second National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education and Pre-Conference Session with Children:

1. The Pre-Conference Session with Children is moved to **November 16, 2020**, and the Second National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education is moved to **November 23-24, 2020**;
2. Change of deadline for the submission of the names of the Resource Speakers and Facilitators for the Parallel Breakout Session to **November 11, 2020**.

This has reference to DM-LA-2020-0198, requesting the assistance of your Office with regard to the Pre-Conference Session with Children originally scheduled on November 9, 2020, and the Second National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education originally scheduled on November 12-13, 2020.

This Office is grateful for your assistance for the Pre-Conference and the Summit thus far. As stated, however, in the previous electronic mail of Atty. Gil Anthony Aquino, this Office regrets

to inform you that the **Pre-Conference** is moved to **November 16, 2020 (Monday)** from **1:00 to 5:00 p.m.**, while the **Summit** is moved to **November 23-24, 2020 (Monday to Tuesday)** from **1:00 to 5:00 p.m.**, in view of the 2021 budget hearing of the DepEd at the Senate which had been scheduled on November 13, the second day of the original schedule of the Summit.

In this regard, this Office would like to provide information on changes in relation to the requests previously sent to your Office for the Pre-Conference and the Summit.

Changes for the Pre-Conference Session and the Summit

This Office requests the assistance of your Office in identifying, inviting, and coordinating **ten (10) student leaders per region** who will attend both the Pre-Conference on November 16, 2020 and the Second National Summit on November 23-24, 2020. We also request your Office to assign one (1) focal person per region to assist in the registration of the identified learners and serve as their guardians during the online event. The focal person shall also register and participate in the Summit. As a guardian, the focal person shall address concerns of these children in coordination with this Office and the organizing team.

This Office requests your Office, through your coordinators and the regional focal persons, to register the identified learners on their behalf through the attached [Google form](#) (click the embedded link or enter this link: <https://tinyurl.com/SecondNationalSummit> into an internet browser), with prior consent from their parents and guardians. The focal person shall also register through the Google form. Registration is requested on or before **November 11, 2020 (Wednesday)**. The link to the online meeting for the Pre-Conference Session and the Summit shall be forwarded upon registration.

Changes for Day 2 of the Summit

For **Day 2 of the Summit**, we would like to request **resource speakers and (2) two facilitators from your Office** to lead the parallel breakout session on the topic of "Student governments" and the role of student leaders and student governments in school and home-based learning. This will be conducted on **November 24, from 1:20 to 2:50 p.m.** Facilitators of all breakout groups will then be requested to provide a 2 to 3 minute synthesis that will be shared with the plenary during the **4:10 to 4:40 p.m.** timeslot. We request to receive a confirmation of the resource speakers and facilitators on or before **November 11, 2020 (Wednesday)**.

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
