IMMEDIATE IMPLEMENTATION OF ENERGY CONSERVATION MEASURES IN THE SCHOOLS OF SDO TAYABAS

1. In support to the President's directive under **Memorandum Circular No. 114, s. 2026** titled **Directing All Government Instrumentalities to Conservation Protocols** and as reiterated in **DepEd Memorandum No. 022, s. 2026** titled **Immediate Implementation of Energy Conservation in Schools**, this Office issued this Memorandum to inform the field of its immediate implementation in all schools of the City Schools Division of the City of Tayabas starting today, **March 27, 2028**.
2. This is to ensure reduction in electricity and fuel consumption in compliance with the **Republic Act No. 11285 (Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act)** as well as **DepEd Order No. 54, s. 20025** titled **Energy Conservation Measures Pursuant to Administrative Order No. 126**.
3. Energy conservation shall be integrated into lessons across learning areas. Such integration shall focus on simple, practical, and actionable measures that learners and teachers can readily adopt in their daily lives including minimizing unnecessary electricity and water consumption, maximizing natural lighting and ventilation, and exercising discipline in the use of electrical devices in school and at home. Instructional delivery should further emphasize the application of these practices beyond the classroom setting particularly at the household level during summer vacation. The Curriculum Implementation Division shall monitor its consistent and effective integration with the lessons as the Division aims at developing this habit among all Tayabasin learners, teachers and employees.
4. All personnel shall ensure strict compliance with established energy efficiency measures. These shall include the judicious use of lighting, proper management of ventilation and cooling systems, and the regular monitoring of electrical equipment usage. All offices and classrooms are expected to be disciplined in energy use consistent with national targets.
5. The implementation of this Memorandum shall be carried out in alignment with **DepEd Memorandum No. 015, s. 2026 (Conduct of the K to 12 Basic Education Program End-of-School-Year Rites for School Year 2025–2026)**. Schools should ensure that energy conservation measures are observed and



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integrated in a manner that does not disrupt or compromise the conduct of said activities and shall promote prudent and efficient use of resources. The same principles shall likewise be observed during the conduct of ARAL Program, Summer programs, and Brigada Eskwela, provided that teacher participation shall remain voluntary and consistent with existing policies on teachers' vacation periods and workload.

6. In relation to this, schools should submit the scanned copies of their monthly electricity bill and water bill whichever is applicable. For monitoring purposes and compliance thereof, schools shall include in the submission the scanned copies of the school bill of the previous month in your respective folder available in this link <https://tinyurl.com/SDOTayabasEnergyCon2026>.

7. This Memorandum shall remain in effect until the provisions of **Memorandum Circular No. 114, s. 2026** are lifted, or until otherwise revoked or superseded by subsequent DepEd issuances.

8. Immediate dissemination and compliance to this Memorandum is desired.

**IMMEDIATE IMPLEMENTATION OF ENERGY
CONSERVATION MEASURES IN SCHOOLS**

1. In support of the President's directive under Memorandum Circular No. 114, s. 2026 (Directing All Government Instrumentalities to Conservation Protocols), mandating all government agencies to implement measures to reduce electricity and fuel consumption, and consistent with the policy provisions of Republic Act No. 11285 (Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act), as well as DepEd Order No. 54, s. 2005 (Energy Conservation Measures Pursuant to Administrative Order No. 126) on the integration of energy conservation in education, the Department of Education reiterates and strengthens its directives to all field offices and schools.
2. In view of the remaining school days, all concerned are enjoined to utilize available instructional time, insofar as practicable, to heighten learners' awareness of the prevailing energy situation, including its national and global implications. This period shall be utilized to ensure that learners are guided toward practical and responsible responses to current energy challenges.
3. Accordingly, all schools shall integrate energy conservation concepts within regular classroom instruction across appropriate learning areas. Such integration shall focus on simple, practical, and actionable measures that learners can readily adopt in their daily lives, including minimizing unnecessary electricity consumption, maximizing natural lighting and ventilation, and exercising discipline in the use of electrical devices at school and at home. Instructional delivery shall further emphasize the application of these practices beyond the classroom setting, particularly at the household level during the summer break. To reinforce learning, schools may engage learners in simple and guided activities that promote awareness and observation of energy use within their immediate environment, including identifying common sources of energy wastage and proposing practical, context-appropriate solutions, consistent with existing learning competencies.
4. All personnel shall ensure strict compliance with established energy-efficiency measures. These shall include the judicious use of lighting, proper management of ventilation and cooling systems, and the regular monitoring of

electrical equipment usage. All offices and classrooms are expected to observe disciplined energy use consistent with national targets.

5. The implementation of this Memorandum shall be carried out in alignment with DepEd Memorandum No. 015, s. 2026 (Conduct of the K to 12 Basic Education Program End-of-School-Year Rites for School Year 2025–2026). Schools shall ensure that energy conservation measures are observed and integrated in a manner that does not disrupt or compromise the conduct of said activities, and shall promote prudent and efficient use of resources. The same principles shall likewise be observed during the conduct of ARAL Program, Summer programs, and Brigada Eskwela, provided that teacher participation shall remain voluntary and consistent with existing policies on teachers' vacation periods and workload.
