1. 2. Guided by the theme *"Bridging Aspiration and Opportunity: Strengthening Industry-School Partnership,"* the activity highlights key reforms in work immersion policies, the revitalization of Technical-Professional tracks in Senior High School, and the culmination of insights from piloting enhanced work immersion programs.
3. The identified participants from this Division are the Education Program Supervisor for TVL / Work Immersion Focal Person, alongside the School Heads and one (1) top industry partner representative from each of the pilot implementing schools as shown in Enclosure 1.
4. As part of the division exhibit, the designated exhibitors are required to prepare a **3ft x 6ft Tarpaulin** showcasing the SDO-level Work Immersion Best Practices, learner work immersion outputs, documentation, and other Means of Verification (MOVs). A video testimonial of a recently hired SHS graduate after completing their work immersion must also be prepared and submitted to the host school.
5. Expenses relative to the exhibit preparation and transportation of the SDO personnel, School Heads, and other concerned DepEd participants shall be charged against local funds, subject to the usual government accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

In line with the scheduled **National Work Immersion Fair on September 11, 2026**, this Office, in strategic partnership with the Private Sector Jobs and Skills Corporation, will conduct a series of **Online Town Hall Meetings** for regional clusters to:

1. Strengthen Public-Private Synergy: Harmonize industry expectations with school-level capacities to ensure high-match, high-impact learner placements;
2. Streamline Digital Onboarding: Orient school focal persons and industry partners on navigating the Work Immersion Portal for tracking and evaluation;
3. Maximize Partnership Incentives: Educate participating industries on the Adopt-a-School Program (ASP) and understand mechanisms on the availment of tax incentives and corporate recognition; and
4. Establish Feedback Mechanisms: Open a direct dialogue between DepEd regional leadership and the private sector to address localized implementation challenges.

The Department of Education (DepEd) will hold the **2026 National Work Immersion Fair** on **May 14, 2026, Thursday, from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM**, across all regions. With the theme **"Bridging Aspiration and Opportunity: Strengthening Industry-School Partnerships."** This event serves as the culmination of pilot program insights aimed at enhancing the Senior High School (SHS) curriculum and Technical-Vocational education.

In support of the implementation of the Strengthened Senior High School Work Immersion Program, this Memorandum provides the procedures for the conduct of the National work Immersion Fair.

This event will serve as a convergence platform for schools and industries to align curriculum to industry needs and build sustainable partnership. The fair will be attended by Regional Directors, Curriculum Learning Management Division (CLMD) Chiefs, Techpro Supervisors, SHS Work Immersion Coordinators, School Heads and their company partners.

Expenses related to the hosting and conduct of Work Immersion Fair shall be charged against the Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) of the host school, subject to usual accounting and auditing. While the transportation of invited school heads shall be charged to their local funds.

In this regard, all ROs are hereby directed to:

1. Coordinate with the School Head of the listed school in your respective region that will serve as the host of the activity;
2. Assign a focal to coordinate with the Central Office focal person, the national agencies, and local government units that will provide the necessary job requirements as listed above;

3. Follow the guide program as attached herein; and
4. Submit a report of post-activity data as to the number of students hired for work immersion, number of commitments from private industry partners, and other relevant information, and send it to the email address as listed below and copy furnish osec@deped.gov.ph.

Further, host schools are requested to send invitations to their partners and conduct planning and coordination meetings to ensure the smooth facilitation of the activity.

In line with the Department's commitment to strengthening the Senior High School (SHS) program, the Department of Education (DepEd) will host the **Nationwide Work Immersion Fair on May 14, 2026**. Organized in collaboration with various government agencies and industry partners, the event highlights key reforms in work immersion policies and the revitalization of Technical-Vocational education in Senior High School, and serves as a culmination of the insights gained from piloting enhanced work immersion programs conducted in close coordination with industry leaders.

Specifically, this fair aims to:

- Ensure robust collaboration between schools and industry;
- Obtain formal commitments from potential partner companies to host work immersion sessions for learners under the pilot Strengthened Senior High School (SHS) Curriculum for the school year 2026-2027; and
- Highlight the readiness of SHS learners for the workforce.

His Excellency **President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.** will be invited to attend the proceedings in one (1) designated region. The specific host school for the Presidential visit shall be finalized by the Office of the President based on submitted nominations.

To facilitate the conduct of the fair, each region is requested to **nominate one (1) school** in their respective region that will serve as host for the event based on these criteria:

- **Profile:** The nominee must be a **Strengthened Technical-Vocational Education Program (STVEP)** school currently implementing the Senior High School TechPro (or TVL) Track.
- **Capacity:** Must have the physical infrastructure and logistical capability to host large-scale gatherings and industry exhibits.

- **Curriculum Leadership:** Priority shall be given to pilot implementers of the Strengthened SHS Curriculum and those offering the TechPro (or TVL) Track.
- **Established Partnerships:** Schools must have an existing and robust network of numerous industry partners to ensure active employer participation.

The following list of recommended participants is provided for the Region's consideration and final approval:

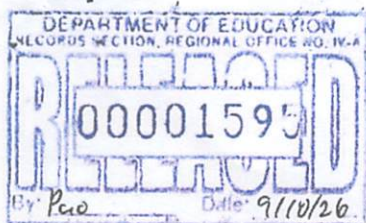
- All school principals and focal persons for Work Immersion.
- Potential industry partners from both the private and public sectors, including regional and city government agencies, that may potentially host work immersion trainees.

While broad participation is highly encouraged, the Regional Offices are granted the discretion to make necessary arrangements and adjustments regarding the final number of attendees, taking into consideration the logistical feasibility and the maximum capacity of the host school.

Relative to the upcoming **2026 National Work Immersion Fair**, with the theme, Bridging Aspirations and Opportunity: Strengthening Industry-School Partnership, please be advised of the definitive schedule and operational guidelines for both the national launch and the localized rollouts.

The **National Launch** of the 2026 National Work Immersion Fair will proceed as scheduled on **September 11, 2026**, at **SMX Olongapo City Convention Center**, hosted by Tapinac Senior High School, in coordination with the Schools Division Office of Olongapo City, Department of Education-Region III, and the Bureau of Curriculum Development (BCD).

The Department extends its highest commendation to all regional offices and schools division offices for their proactive preparations and high state of readiness for the localized rollouts. To further capitalize on this readiness and maximize industry engagement, the conduct of all **Localized Work Immersion Fairs across all other regions will be moved to September 18, 2026**, in direct alignment with the nationwide observance of Department of Trade and Industry Week from September 14 to 20, 2026.

This strategic synchronization ensures that localized activities leverage nationwide trade and industry partnerships, bringing substantial opportunities to host schools and learners. All field offices are instructed to maintain their current technical preparations, partner pledges, and coordination structures in anticipation of the September 18 nationwide localized launch.

Central Office (CO) officials and Technical Working Group (TWG) members assigned to Region III shall proceed with their deployment for the September 11 National
