

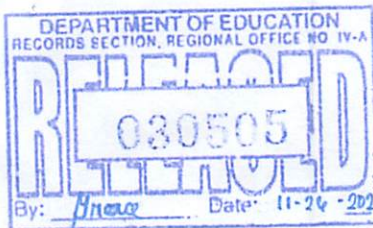

DATE : September 30, 2025

Pursuant to Executive Order No. 56, dated May 25, 2018, the number "911" is institutionalized as the Nationwide Emergency Hotline Number.

The 911 system serves as the government's central emergency hotline for all types of emergencies, including but not limited to police, fire, medical, and mental health concerns. The system also integrates national agencies and local units into one coordinated platform for a more efficient response.

In this regard, all DepEd offices and stakeholders are highly encouraged to use the 911 hotline to report emergencies.
