

1. With its mission to promote and sustain excellence in English Language Teaching, DepEd Tayabas City announces the conduct of the 1<sup>st</sup> CALABARZON English Language Camp (CELCamp) – Tayabas, a year-round initiative which will highlight lectures and workshops in teaching speaking, listening, reading, writing, viewing, digital presentation, language assessment and other issues in language teaching and learning. (Tentative Venue: SDO Tayabas; Date: To be announced.)

2. This generally intends to enhance the teaching skills and core competencies of English teachers in Tayabas City. Specifically, this activity aims to:

- a. apply the knowledge and principles of linguistic study to practical language teaching in their own context;
- b. discuss and demonstrate understanding of the major approaches and methods influencing second language acquisition;
- c. enhance and strengthen Tayabense English teachers' competence in teaching the different macro skills; and
- d. share their best practices in teaching the macro skills in their respective schools.

3. This three-day training is live-out. Each participant shall contribute **P 200.00** donation/ participation fee to cover the speaker-volunteer's honorarium, transportation, accommodation and other related expenses which shall be charged to local fund, provincial local funds and /or city's special education fund subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

4. Participants are requested to bring their own snacks and packed lunch.

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5. The host which will be announced sooner or later shall take charge of the logistics including registration and documentation/ write-up for publication and the necessary preparations/ support required before, during and after the camp.

6. CELCamp trainers will include the CALABARZON teacher-scholars who obtained their diplomas/ specialist certificates at the SEAMEO Regional Language Center in Singapore and other language experts/ specialist.

7. This project will cater 250 elementary and secondary English teachers including Master Teachers, Key Teachers, English Coordinators and English Reading Specialists, which will be grouped into five (5) classes composed of 40-50 campers per class.

8. The five classes will have different learning targets. The target courses and participants include the following:

9. There will be a 20-minute demonstration teaching on the last day of the camp with 10-minute academic exchange per demonstration camper, at least 2-3 campers per class. They are expected to prepare their Daily Lesson Log (DLL). Learning target during the demonstration teaching should focus on the concepts learned during the sessions/ workshops. The TWG shall choose at least three Master Teachers or experts who will serve as observers during the actual demonstration teaching.

10. Attached is the list of the Division English Team Officers who shall report earlier to prepare the training venue and the needed materials relative to the conduct of the training.

11. In lieu of the services rendered on a weekend, holiday or vacation by all concerned, all participants and other persons involved shall be entitled for service credits.
