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General Guidelines for the 2017 ICT Month Celebration

A. Participants

- 1. The participants of the 2017 ICT Month Celebration will showcase their best products and performances in the different events as an evidence of their learning in the different learning areas;
- 2. Participation is open to any pupil/student currently enrolled in public or private elementary and secondary schools for SY 2017-2018;
- 3. A pupil/student is allowed to participate in one (1) event/skill exhibition/contest only.
- 4. The teacher-coach/trainer/adviser of the top 3 record holders shall each receive a division certificate of recognition.
- 5. Participants of the Contests and Training Workshop must submit the online registration at http://www.deped.in/tayabasictmonth2017 on or before June 23, 2017.

B. General Orientation/Briefing

- 1. Orientation regarding the events of the different skills exhibition is scheduled after the opening program;
- After the general orientation, coaches/trainers of each event will have a briefing with the event administrator/facilitator/coordinator/focal person on the mechanics and other details of the specific skills exhibition. The venue of the orientation will be announced during the registration of official participants;
- 3. All clarifications, issues and concerns regarding the contests shall be addressed during the orientation. Any concerns raised during the actual skills exhibition shall not be entertained unless they are valid and necessary;
- 4. Distribution of needed supplies and materials, if applicable to the event, shall be done at the venue. Hence, participants are enjoined to be at the venue an hour before the start of the skills exhibition; and
- 5. Participants are encouraged to visit the venue of the event a day before the actual skills exhibition.

C. Mechanics for Judging the Skills Exhibition

- 1. The products and performances of participants in all events shall be judged by three members of the board of judges composed of experts and practitioners;
- The score of the three judges in any event shall be computed to determine the AVERAGE of each participant/team. The average score shall be the basis for ranking the products/performances of participants to determine the top 3 record holders;

- 3. Tabulation, consolidation and review of all results shall be done by representatives from the host school;
- 4. The final results shall be reviewed by the members of the board of Judges before they affix their signatures to the summary sheet;
- 5. In case of a tie, triple tie or a quadruple tie, the participant who finished with the shortest/fastest time will be declared as the "Record Holder." In the event of another tie, the chair of the board of judges will decide; and
- 6. The decision of the board of judges is final and irrevocable.

E. Skills Exhibition Proper

- 1.1. The event administrators and their secretaries, technical committee and judges, should be in the venue sixty (60) minutes ahead of the event schedule.
- 1.2. Event materials, supplies, tools, equipment and other things needed at the venue will be made ready by the event administrator sixty (60) minutes before the event schedule.
- 1.3. All participants should be at the designated venue fifteen (15) minutes before the event starts. Late participants without valid reasons shall be disqualified.
- 1.4. Setting up of their extension cords, equipment, and tools should be done during this time.
- 1.5. The briefing of participants will be done fifteen (15) minutes before the scheduled event.
- 1.6. The event secretary will give the signal for the event to begin. Once the event has started, the coaches, teachers, and delegates are no longer allowed to talk to the participants to allow them to fully concentrate on their work.
- 1.7. Only the event administrator, secretary, technical staff, judges, official photographer, and participants are allowed in the venue.
- 1.8. No questions shall be entertained during the contest proper except clarifications and points of order. All clarifications and points of order shall be raised with the event administrator.
- 1.9. Should there be any irregularities found during the event, the event administrator, in consultation with the board of judges, may suspend the conduct of the specific skill exhibition, if justified, and refer the matter to the attention of the Technical and Evaluation Committee for appropriate action.
- 1.10. Borrowing of materials, tools, and supplies during the event is not allowed.
- 1.11. The working area should be cleaned immediately after every event.
- 1.12. All outputs shall be endorsed to the Secretariat by the event administrator
- 1.13. All endorsed outputs shall be displayed throughout the duration of the event

Featured Video Contest (Elementary)

Featured Video Contest is a 3-5-minute video competition showcase delicacy, place or remarkable person of Tayabas. This aims to promote the distinct features and mesmerizing beauty of the City. The material should be limited only to a particular topic and revolve around the theme. The outputs will be submitted to LRMDS and will be used as instructional material.

The content should reflect historical perspective – the causes and consequences of an event. It should also be able to impart new knowledge and promote positive values.

1. The contest is open to all bona fide students and teachers of the participating school. Each team shall be composed of ten (10) members (combination of teachers and students). One teacher shall serve as coach/leader who will supervise the team. The team shall be composed but not limited to the following:

- Director
- Videographer
- Voice Talent / Narrator
- Editor

Incomplete team or excess members shall be subjected to penalty.

2. The entry shall focus only in one particular topic. They may choose to feature delicacies (processes, historical value, significance, etc.), historical place or remarkable person (unsung hero, famous personality, awardees, etc.) in the city. Each team is FREE to create their own theme.

3. All footages must be original. In case past events need to be included, the contestants must secure a written permission to the owner and provide the organizers a copy of the permission signed by both parties. The clip which will be included shall be given proper credits. Works submitted in other competitions (part or whole) are not allowed for submission.

4. The teams shall provide their own equipment and materials. Other expenses shall also be shouldered by the team (transportation, food, etc.).

5. Minors must be accompanied by the coach/teachers/parents during the data gathering / shooting to ensure the security and safety of learners. If possible, ask for a waiver/permit from the parents.

6. The entry should be 3-5 minutes long. Violation of the time limit will result to 3 points deduction in the total score.

7. Media ethics shall be observed. Sensitive matters should not appear in the material. The

person/s involved may demand for his confidentiality if he wishes.

8. An oral interview will be set during the contest. Members of the team must be ready to answer the questions from the judges.

9. Submission of entries is on **June 27, 2017, 9AM**. The entry shall be saved in a CD, placed in a short brown envelope.

10. The organizers reserve the right to reproduce and distribute the materials for instructional purposes. Moreover, they have the right to request for reediting of the material.

11. The decision of the board of judges is final and irrevocable.

Documentary (Secondary)

Documentary Contest is a video competition that will showcase culture, tourist spot, and history of Tayabas. This aims to promote the distinct features and mesmerizing beauty of the city.

The documentary shall be historically accurate. It should not simply recount facts but interpret and analyze them. It should also reflect historical perspective – the causes and consequences of an event. It shall demonstrate why the topic is significant and shall draw conclusion from it. It should be of high visual and production quality. The simpler is often better.

1. The contest is open to all bona fide students and teachers of the participating school. Each team shall be composed of ten (10) members (combination of teachers and students). One teacher shall serve as coach/leader who will supervise the team. The team shall be composed but not limited to the following:

- Director
- Scriptwriter
- Videographer
- Voice Talent / Narrator
- Editor

Incomplete team or excess members shall be subjected to penalty.

2. The entry shall focus only in one particular topic. They may choose to feature culture and tradition (values, traits, etc.), tourist spots in the city, or history of a particular barangay or community. Each team is FREE to create their own theme.

3. All footages must be original. In case past events need to be included, the contestants must secure a written permission to the owner and provide the organizers a copy of the permission signed by both parties. The clip which will be included shall be given proper credits. Works submitted in other competitions (part or whole) are not allowed for submission.
